This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students achieving a 'B' standard or above in English from 33% in year 3 (2015) to 66% in Year 4 (2016).
- Increase the percentage of students achieving a 'B' standard or above in English from 20% in year 4 (2015) to 50% in Year 5 (2016).
- Increase the percentage of students in the NAPLAN U2B from 0% in 2015 Year 3 reading to 50% in 2016 Year 3 reading.
- Increase the percentage of students in the NAPLAN U2B from 0% in 2015 Year 5 reading to 50% in 2016 Year 5 reading.
- 80% of students in Year 3 will achieve National Minimum Standard for reading.
- 80% of students in Year 5 will achieve National Minimum Standard for reading.

Our initiatives include

- Develop teaching staff knowledge and understanding to improve teaching and learning of reading across the curriculum.
- Develop a whole school approach to support the teaching of literacy across the learning areas.
- Writing U2B initiative for Year 4/5 students via IMPACT Centre Project – Booster Just Write.
- Numeracy U2B initiative for Year 4/5 students via IMPACT Centre Project – Booster Solve IT.

Provide professional development opportunities for teaching team members to improve teaching and learning of reading across the curriculum (TRS days = 7).	\$2800
Teaching staff will attend regional writing professional development module (n = 3).	\$2895
IMPACT Centre Project online learning – Year 4 & Year 5 students (n = 8).	\$2200
Employ contract teacher to support students' skill development in NAPLAN skills; problem solving strategies and building vocabulary.	\$5795
Purchase online software programmes to support student skill development.	\$1900
